CAMPUS MINISTRY COMMISSION CO-LEADERS/ CATHOLIC STUDENT COMMUNITY OFFICERS

Two current Iowa State University students serve as co-chairs of the Campus Ministry Commission of St. Thomas Aquinas Church and catholic Student Center and are concurrently two student officers of the Catholic Student Community (CSC), a student organization at Iowa State University.

The Campus Ministry Commission meets monthly to review campus ministry's mission and activities, to help set priorities, and to evaluate the ministry as a whole. The ministry includes representatives from the various student teams as well as students to represent a wide variety of student constituencies at Saint Thomas (including graduate students, students living in the residence halls and Greek houses, students, as well as students who regularly attend Mass at Saint Thomas but are not involved in other areas of ministry.)

One co-leader, who is designated at CSC president, is also an ex-officio member of the St. Thomas Aquinas Parish Council and attends all Parish Council meetings. The other co-leader serves at CSC treasurer.

Both co-leaders are expected to attend all the Campus Ministry Commission meetings, usually on the third Wednesday of each month that ISU is in session.

Both co-leaders are also expected to assure the registration of CSC as a student organization at ISU and to fulfill all the obligations of president and treasurer.

The co-leaders meet with the director of campus ministry to set the agenda for each monthly meeting.

SECRETARY

This person takes the minutes for each meeting and sends them to all members within a week after the meeting. He or she also assists the co-leader with amendments to the constitution, and whatever written communication becomes necessary.

CONSTITUENT REPRESENTATIVE

Constituent representatives speak on behalf of the group they represent to make sure that St. Thomas offers programming that meets the needs of their special interest group.
